

COMMONS ACT 2006 – SECTION 15(1)**Notice of an application for the registration of land as a Town or Village Green****Ladies Walk Down (East), Andover – VG280**

To every reputed owner, lessee, tenant or occupier of any part of the land described below and to all others whom it may concern.

Application has been made to Hampshire County Council by Mr Paul Howland of 71 Springfield Close, Andover, SP10 2QR under section 15(1) of the Commons Act 2006 and in accordance with the Commons (Registration of Town or Village Greens) (Interim Arrangements) (England) Regulations 2007. The application seeks the inclusion in the register of town and village greens of the land described in the Schedule below, which is claimed to have qualified for registration as a town or village green on 13th April 2024, by virtue of a significant number of local inhabitants having indulged in lawful sports and pastimes on the land, as of right, for a period of at least twenty years.

A copy of the application, which includes a plan of the land proposed for registration, may be obtained by contacting the Countryside Access Team at countryside@hants.gov.uk or at the offices of Test Valley Borough Council and Andover Town Council.

If the registration authority is satisfied that the land described below qualifies for registration as a town or village green, it will so register the land.

The personal data you provide in any representation will be treated in accordance with Data Protection Legislation. It may be published in a decision report and be disclosed to other interested parties, including the landowner (or their representatives). It will become part of the permanent records kept on commons and village greens in Hampshire. The legal basis for our use of this information is the compliance with a legal obligation – Commons Act 2006.

Any representations that are to be taken into account by the Authority in reaching a decision on the application cannot be treated as confidential and will be copied to the applicant for comment, and may be disclosed to other interested parties.

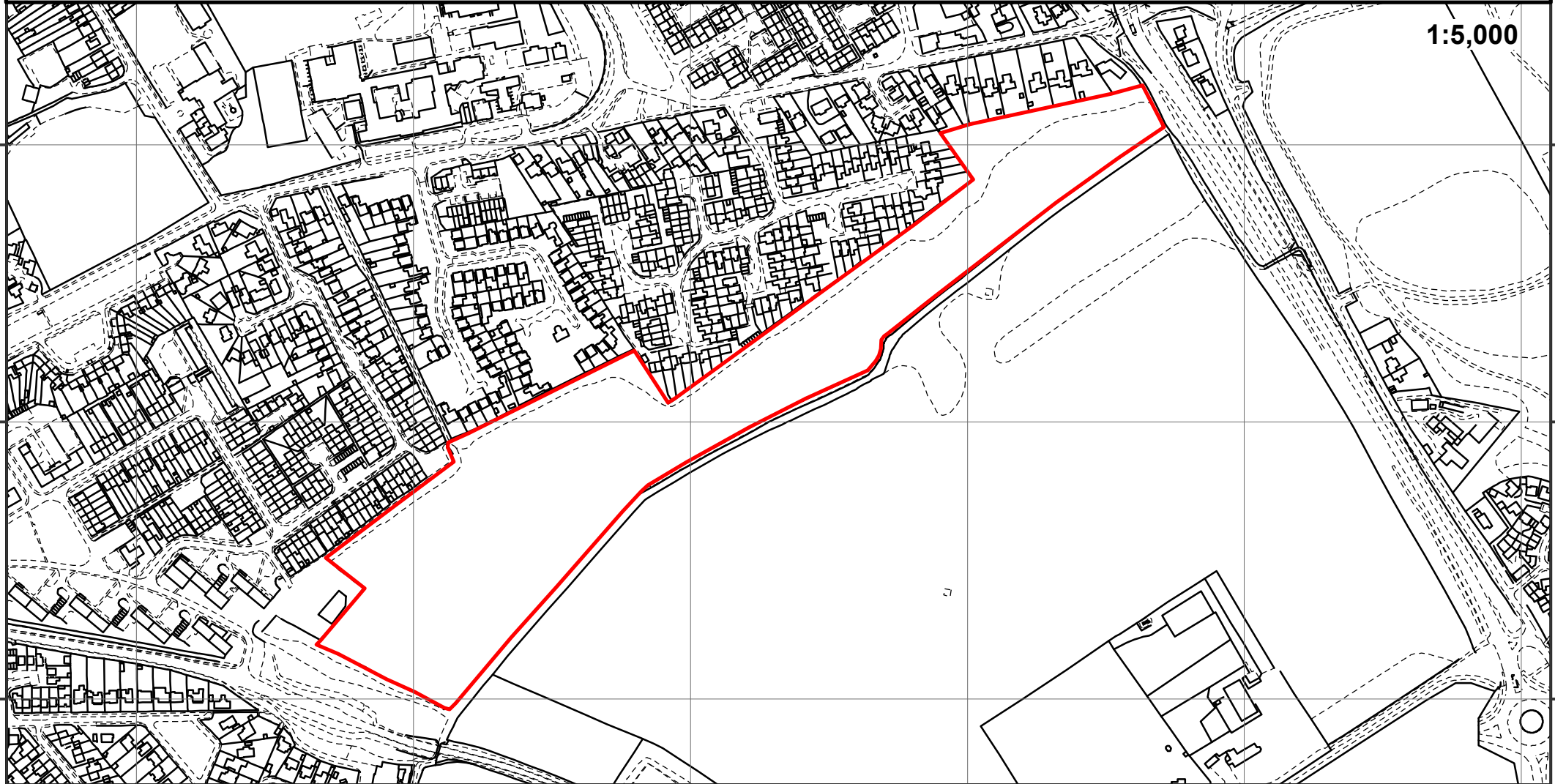
